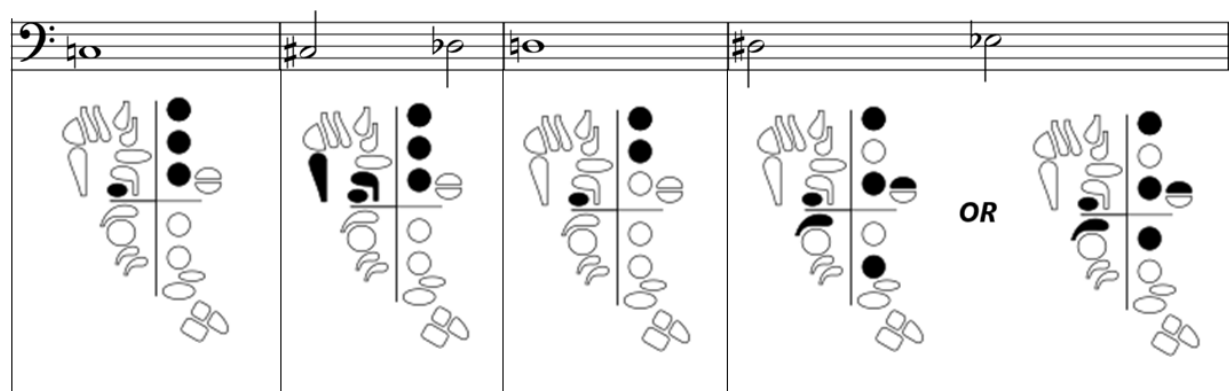
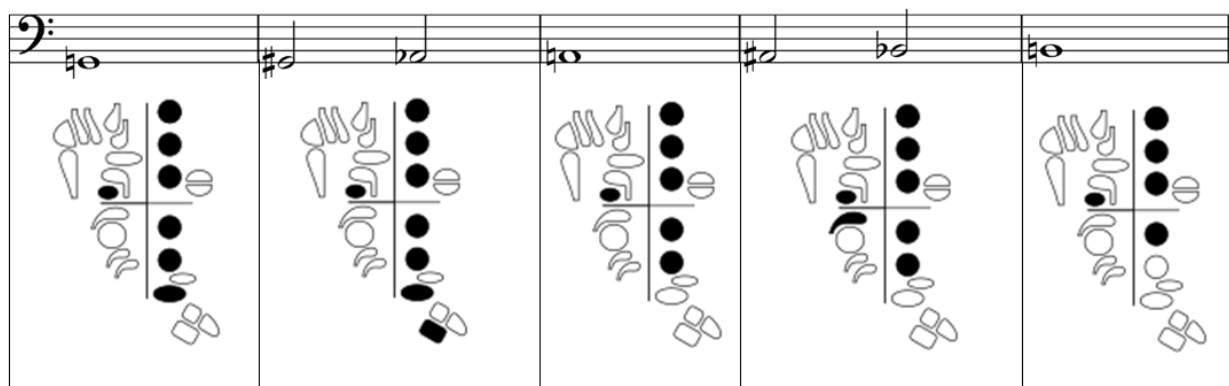
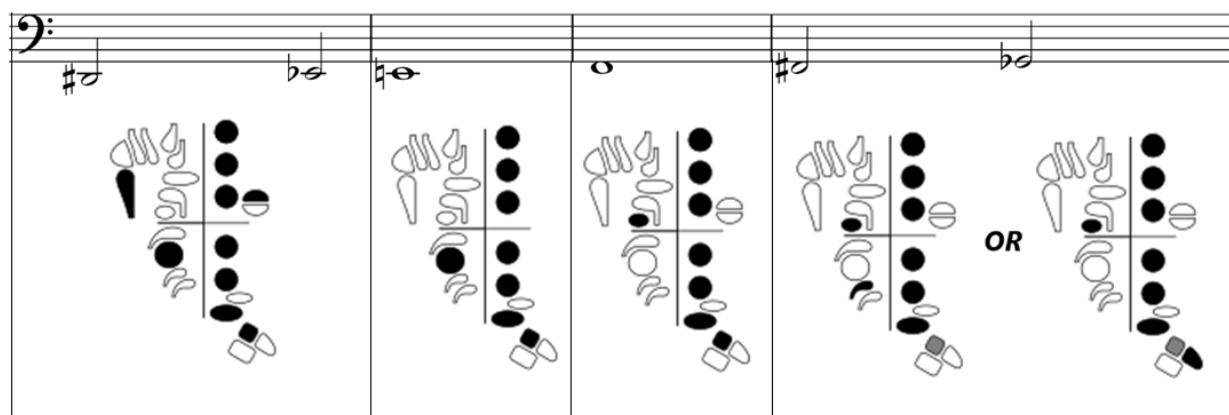
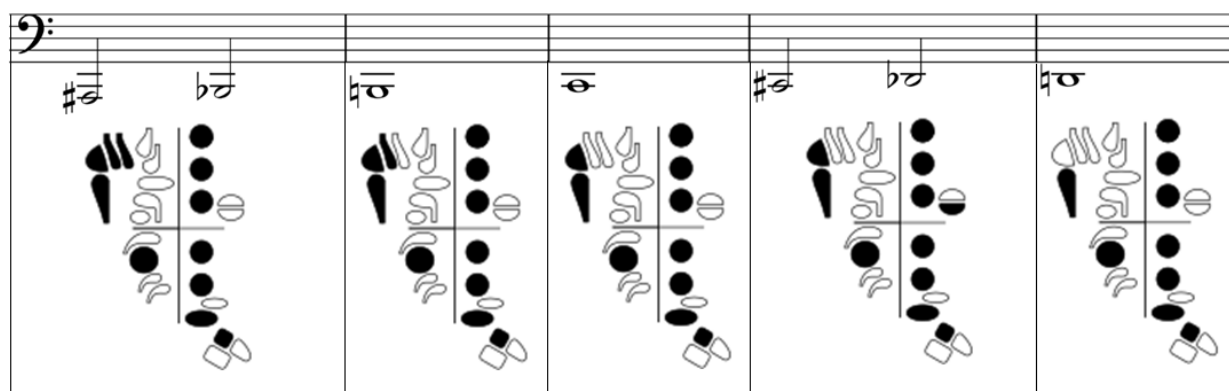


# BASSOON FINGERING CHART
